PETITIONER AMERICAN FUEL & PETROCHEMICAL MANUFACTURERS' NONBINDING STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Pursuant to this Court's order of March 2, 2022, petitioner American Fuel & Petrochemical Manufacturers ("AFPM") submits this Nonbinding Statement of Issues in the consolidated cases challenging the final action of the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") entitled Revised 2023 and Later Model Year Light-Duty Vehicle Greenhouse Gas Emissions Standards, published at 86 Fed. Reg. 74434 (Dec. 30, 2021). The issues presented are (1) whether EPA exceeded its statutory authority under Section 202 of the Clean Air Act by setting greenhouse gas emission standards for light-duty vehicles that effectively mandate electric vehicles, and (2) whether EPA's cost-benefit analysis was arbitrary and capricious because, among other reasons, EPA failed

to conduct a lifecycle analysis to account for the greenhouse gas emission impacts of electric vehicles.
